Her family back on the islands is increasingly dependent on her financial support, and there's a promising relationship with a young man her father's never met. Meanwhile back on Kiribati fragile sea walls are crumbling, and storm tides are sweeping into villages. Suddenly one day Maria receives news that her beloved father is very ill. She must return home immediately...
